
NOAA Ocean Acidification Program (SEC. 12406)

The NOAA Ocean Acidification Program (OAP) was established under SEC. 12406. of the Federal Ocean Acidification and Monitoring Act (FOARAM) to oversee and coordinate research, monitoring, and other activities consistent with the strategic research and implementation plan developed by the interagency working group on ocean acidification.

Vision

"A nation, globally engaged and guided by science, sustaining healthy marine and coastal ecosystems, communities, and economies through informed response to ocean acidification"

Strategic research plan to guide:

"Federal research and monitoring on ocean acidification that will provide for an assessment of the impacts of ocean acidification on marine organisms and marine ecosystems and the development of adaption and mitigation strategies to conserve marine organisms and marine ecosystems."

Coastal and estuarine acidification, to the extent that the cause of the acidification can be traced back to anthropogenic atmospheric inputs to the ocean, are assumed to be covered

Per FOARAM, the original draft plan was open for **public comment** for two months and also was reviewed by the **National Research Council**.






