- Be more strategic and targeted in our activities and hold more action/decision oriented meetings.




Options and Opportunities for the USCRTF to contribute to the National Ocean Policy:

 - Regional Ecosystem Protection and Restoration
 - Water Quality and Sustainable Practices on Land





 Proactively engage in the Coastal and Marine Spatial Planning process in the Pacific and Caribbean regions.
