




A RESOLUTION OF ATOLL LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Protected Areas Network

- PAN Act 2015
 - Codified the Reimaanlok and Micronesia Challenge
 - Integration of all protected areas into a single system
 - Funding mechanism for MC endowment disbursements
- Next step
